The RBCAA has a proven record, with 25 years of significant data accumulation.


The RBCAA has also been a forum to bring together role players from industry who can resolve common problems

Send your complaint to complaints@rbcaa.co.za with the following information: Name and phone number (you may remain anonymous), location, date; time, details of complaint, physical symptoms, if any.
